## Big Names, Big Purses Highlight Summer '08

#### Zito's \$1 Million Derby

Under blue skies, and in front of a spirited crowd Labor Day crowd, trainer Nick Zito scored his second ever PA Derby win with 16-1 shot Anak Nakal on September 1. Jockey Joe Bravo was aboard for Four Horsemen Thoroughbreds, scoring his third Derby win. Prior to 2008, he won with Meadow Flight in 1994 and with Grand Hombre in '03.

The day also marked the completion and grand opening of the first new barn on the Philadelphia Park backstretch. Used as the new receiving barn,

the renovated structure housed the first of the stakes competitors accompanied by their grooms shipping in early Monday morning for the day's card.

#### Revival of Greenwood Cup Marks New Era

Returning to the Philadelphia Park stakes schedule on July 19 after a three-year absence, was the \$250,000 Greenwood Cup at 1 1/2 miles. Multiple graded stakes winner and fan-favorite Evening Attire scored his 40th and final career victory in track record time under Jose Espinoza. (continued on page 8)

#### **Living Legends Tour Stops at Philadelphia Park**

Racing Hall of Fame jockeys Pat Day, Angel Cordero, Jr., and Laffit Pincay sport PTHA Turning For Home hats at Philadelphia Park on October 5 as part of the Breeders' Cup Legends Tour. The multi-city tour includes appearances at nine racetracks and a hotel and casino in Las Vegas before its final stop at Santa Anita. Cordero, is best known at Philadelphia Park for his exciting ride aboard Broad Brush in the 1986 PA Derby. Trained by Richard Small, Broad Brush bolted to the outside rail at the top of the stretch, but still won the race for owner Robert Meyerhoff. Fourteen years later, Pat Day won the Derby with Summer Squall, trained by Neil Howard for the Dogwood Stable.

#### "Feels Good to Be Home"

Philadelphia Park owner Joel DuBow welcomes lan's Rocket home after the 10-year-old retired from racing last month. DuBow races under the name Paladin Inc., and Ian's Rocket was the first horse he chose on his own when he and Bob Seeger teamed up to claim horses six years ago. Although DuBow lost lan's Rocket through the claim box years ago, he kept track of the old fellow through Equibase's Virtual Stable.

"He was a \$7.500 claim who earned over \$100,000 for us," said Dubow. "On PA-bred Day, he finished third to Docent in a 7 furlong stake. We had him for two full years before Michael Gill took him for \$45.000."

Becoming concerned after the classy veteran dropped into the \$3,500 ranks at Ft. Erie, DuBow contacted the trainer and arranged to get him back.

"I was worried because I know that horse slaughter is legal in Canada, and I don't know where he would have ended up when he was done racing."

Trainer Denyse McClachrie had scratched him from his last race, and the owner, Shale Wagman set up shipping arrangements to get him back to Dubow.

Stepping off the trailer at Hill Haven Farm in New Jersey, lan's Rocket's coat glistened and he was in good weight after his long trip. Prancing about on the end of the lead shank, he looked much the same as Dubow remembered him.

"He was always a spirited horse," said Dubow. "He loved to gallop, and he loved to train. He'd dance around like Mohammed Ali out there -- a real challenge for his exercise boy. I am so glad to have him home."

After some well-deserved time off. Dubow will look for somone to give lan a permanent home and new career.

In recent months, through the efforts of the PTHA and Philadelphia Park, thoroughbred racing in the Commonwealth has undergone many positive changes. Our racetrack, in particular, has been recognized by the racing industry due to the strength of our horsemen's contract, the advent of casino wagering at Philadelphia Park, our substantial increase in purses, our tremendous care of backstretch personnel with some of the best medical, dental and prescription coverages, our \$25 million backstretch renovation project, and our model horse rescue program--the first of its kind in the nation.

Our purse increases to \$250,000 a day (and still growing) have provided the incentive to improve our product and strengthen our racing and breeding programs in Pennsylvania.

With the 29th running of the PA Derby on Labor Day now offering \$1 million in purse money, we attracted a full field of 13 entrants to this year's race, including some of the nation's budding three-year-old stars. Just a week earlier, PA-bred day showcased the best of our statebreds,

offering eight races with full fields and nearly \$1 million in purses.

The PTHA has worked hard to protect and provide for our horsemen the guarantee of live racing, increased purses, and health care for our families. I look forward to expanding on these accomplishments -- and the best is yet to come!





# Turning For Home Teams With TRF to Place Horses in Maryland Correctional Facility Turning For Home will sponsor the construction of a new roof on

Turning For Home will sponsor the construction of a new roof on the barn at the Maryland Department of Public Safety and Correctional Services facility in Sykesville, Md. In return, many of the Turning For Home horses will be provided safe haven and a second chance at life, along with the inmates who will care for them.

It will be the eighth TRF program at a correctional facility, and the first time Turning For Home has teamed up with the TRF.

The TRF program oversees an officer with expertise in horse care at

each facility. Inmates will be responsible for building the barns, fences and paddocks, maintenance of the farm, and complete care of the horses from feeding to grooming.

"We are very proud and happy to join with the Thoroughbred Retirement Foundation in this very worthwhile project," said



Turning For Home's Program Administrator Barbara Luna. "The TRF's successful history with placing over 300 horses in this kind of program offers a safe and useful life to horses who may otherwise end up at slaughter, as well as rehabilitating and finding useful careers for prison inmates."

The new facility is scheduled to open this fall.



## Intrinsic Worth Headed to "The Big Easy"

When trainer Hilary Pridham lost track of Intrinsic Worth, she suspected the worst for the handsome 7-year-old son of Red Ransom.

But careful research found him after PhiladelphiaPark trainer Lisa Aitchison placed him with Turning For Home.

Intrinsic Worth started his career at Arlington Park, and raced 53 times, winning nine races and \$221,608 "I worked with him as a two-year-old and we just loved him," she said. "We'll ship him to Lexington and turn him out while we are at Keeneland, then in November, back home to Louisiana." Pridham hopes to train him to be a stable pony, but says "it doesn't matter if he can do it or not, I'll be happy to have him around."



The 10-year-old gelding was retired in September with earnings of over \$2.9 million.

The race, named for Bob Green and Bill Hogwood. co-founders of Greenwood Racing

which owns Philadelphia Park, returned as part of the Breeders' Cup Challenge Series, automatically qualifying the winner for the 2008 BC Marathon.

"We are so happy to have the Greenwood Cup back on the schedule," said Bill Hogwood, who presented the trophy to owners Joe and Mary Grant. "We look forward to higher purses and attracting great horses to the track because of the additional money from the slot machines and gaming. It is the start of a new era here at Philadelphia Park.'

#### 2009 FOAL REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS

FOAL REGISTRATION ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA - A Thoroughbred foal born in the state of Pennsylvania in 2009 and registered as such with The Jockey Club is eligible for Pennsylvania-Bred registration with the Pennsylvania Horse Breeders Association if at least one of the following conditions is met:

- (1) The dam of the foal resided continuously in Pennsylvania on or before October 1, 2008, through foaling; or
- (2) The dam of the foal was purchased at a public sale after October 1, 2008, then brought into Pennsylvania within 14 days of the date of purchase, and remained in Pennsylvania through foaling. During the year of foaling (2009), the foal or its dam must spend at least 90 days in the state: or
- (3) The dam of the foal will be bred in 2009 to a stallion standing in Pennsylvania which is registered with the Pennsylvania Horse Breeders Association as a Pennsylvania stallion, and said dam of the foal will remain in Pennsylvania for at least the next 90 days after foaling.

# Chaplain's Corner

"Building a Monument"

Chickamauga National Park near Chattanooga, Tennessee is home to a monument to a riderless horse. During the Civil War Battle of Chickamauga, the young Wisconsin cavalry officer on his mount lost his life in the early morning of "the bloodiest two-day battle of the war." But his horse continued charging all morning with "almost human bravery" until bullets felled it around noon. Witnesses to its gallantry buried the animal near the spot where it died. Today, the "Wisconsin Monument" memorializes the courage of "the horse with the terrified eyes." We all admire courage, whether it's seen in animals or in humans. We construct memorials to greatness.

To people of courageous faith, we erect monuments because they dared to trust God against all odds. The Bible refers to the numerous persecutions endured by many in the Old Testament and concludes, "the world was not worthy of them." For sure, those words could be etched in granite to those believers. The New Testament apostles paid for their faith with their lives. Their fierce loyalty to God sustained them and they changed their world. In fact, the Scriptures say they "turned the world upside down." The prophets and apostles altered their external world because of something inside them – their absolute trust in the living God. Today, churches around the world are sacred monuments to those people of faith.

What kind of monument are you and I building? If we were to be memorialized, how about having our name recorded in stone followed by three words -- "person of faith."


