### 2005 PENNSYLVANIA DERBY

abor Day 2005 was a picture perfect day to highlight our biggest day of racing in the Keystone State, Pennsylvania Derby Day.

Picnickers with family in tow queued up early to stake their claim to

a picnic table. An outdoor concert and kiddie rides and games created a carnival atmosphere on a day that weathermen described

as "beautiful".

With over \$1,000,000 in purses up for grabs, the com-

tition figured to be keen. Racing secretary Sal Sinatra along with assistant Phil Parker assembled the largest field ever for the Pennsylvania Derby. It was 14 three year olds who loaded in the gate for the Derby in what seemed like a contentious race. The crowd made Tracy Farmer's "Sun King" the 6/5 favorite and he rewarded his many backers in the crowd with a facile 3 length win.

Trained by Nick Zito and ridden by

Raphael Bejarano, "Sun
King" parlayed a win
in Delaware's Leonard Richard
Stakes and a
second place finish in Monmouth's

Haskell to springboard to the PA Derby Winner's Circle.

California based "Southern Africa", accompanied by trainer Mike Puhich and rider Tyler Baze, made the cross country trip a success by closing from out of the clouds to nose "Smoke-screen" for the place.

The ladies also had their day in the sun, as two supporting stakes were slated for fillies. In the 8th running of the \$100,000 Pennsylvania Oaks, favoritism fell to Live Oak Plantation's "Hide and Chic", coming off a 2nd place fin-

My wife Betty and I attended the ceremony and it was very gratifying to see the grooms receiving a completion certificate and a jacket embroidered with the Groom Elite logo and rightfully so, a proud look on each face. Grooms are a very important segment of the racing industry. What would we do without them?

Saturday, July 23rd the Pennsylvania ay at the Races was held with each ennsylvania Bred race worth a guaranteed \$50,000. Congratulations go to the following:

The Flatterer Steeplechase Stake was the first to be off at about 2 1/16 miles for 4 year-olds and up went to Party Airs, owners Sarah K. & Kenneth L. Ramsey, trainer Thomas H. Voss.

The Devil's Honor Handicap for 3 year-olds and up at 7 furlongs was won by E & G Stables' Senor Cielo Two trained by Jayne Vaders.

The Iroquois Handicap for 3 yearolds and up at 1 1/16 miles was won by Nittany Express, owned by Green Eyed Stable and trained by Todd M. Beattie.

Next came the Ambassador of Luck Handicap for fillies and mares 3 years old and up at 7 furlongs. Valley of the Gods was the winner, owned by David O'Neill and trained by Keith Barron.

The race named after our sadly missed friend, the Robert W. Camac Memorial Stake for 3 year olds and up going 5/8 on the turf was taken by

Kenyon G. Furlong's Shades of Sunny, trainer T. Bernard Houghton. It was my privilege and honor to make the presentation to Mr. Furlong and his connections.

Lastly, but in no way least, the Mrs. Penny Stakes 1 1/16 on the turf for fillies and mares 3 years old and up went to Dynamic Cat, owned by Augustin Stable and trained by Jonathan Sheppard.

What a great day of racing to showcase our PA Breds!

August 6th was the \$100,000 guaranteed Larry Riviello President's Cup. Legal Control won the 1 mile 70 yards contest for 3 year-olds, owner Fitzhugh, LLC and trainer Richard W. Small. Again, I was privileged to make the trophy presentation to Mr. Fitzhugh.

I publicly thank management and my horse men and women for bestowing the honor of posting a race in my name.

After the Pennsylvania State Horse Racing Commission meeting on August 17th, the Equine Health, Care and Safety Committee met, chaired by Commissioner Rick Abbott.

Agenda items included: "Milk-shaking in thoroughbreds", points for discussion on pre-racesodiumbicarbonate administration were 1. Update on sodium bicarbonate performance issues. 2. Discussion with horsemen at both tracks.

3. Mechanism for unannounced prerace surveillance – where and how? 4. Mechanism for payment of surveillance. There was an update on EPO detection and confirmation and "Alcohol in Thoroughbreds".

Our track was closed for training from August 11th until August 29th. There were no outriders available on opening day. The horsemen's thanks go to Danny Lopez, backed up by Steve Rowan for doing the job of the outriders.

The new race track surface has a bottom of 6 inches of limestone, 1.5 inches of clay, and topped with a mixture of sand and clay for a cushion.

Friday, September 2nd, the annual Pig Roast was held in back of the recreation hall from 11 am to 4 pm. We had great food, beautiful weather and a variety of music. The Chaplain's fundraiser was a rousing success. Lots of good prizes. If you missed it this year be sure you make it next year.

September 5th was a red-letter day for local trainer Alfredo "Freddie" Velazquez and his son, jockey Daniel Velazquez when they paired up to win the \$75,000 guaranteed 32nd running of the Steve Van Buren Handicap with Annika Lass. The 4 year old filly is owned by Anita Stable, named after Mrs. Anita Velazquez, Freddie's wife. A real family affair!

Also on Labor Day the 8th running of the \$100,000 guaranteed Pennsylvania Oaks for 3 year old fillies was won by Amazing Buy, owner Paraneck Stable and trainer Jennifer Pederson.

The 27th renewal of the Grade II, Pennsylvania Derby worth a whopping \$750,000 for 3 year old colts or geldings was the highlight of the day. Trainer Nick Zito brought his star, Sun King to win handily for owner Tracy Farmer.

But then the quiet is suddenly filled with the sounds of clapping and lively anticipation, a helicopter appears overhead; swooping down by the paddocks, then back up again. But everyone is looking towards the opening of the new stallion barn - someone is coming around the corner - Katherine Baker Knoll, the Lt. Governor? Dennis Wolff, the Secretary of Agriculture? No, it's a big stallion - - all of a sudden it's real quiet here - NO, it's REAL QUIET - winner of the 1998 Kentucky Derby and Preakness, HERE, here in Grantville, PA.

This was the setting for a "Welcome Real Quiet Party" on August 25, 2005 at Reigle Heir Farms, the stallion farm owned by Dennis Madonna. State and local dignitaries, investors, owners, breeders, family and friends along with all the farm staff gathered under a huge white tent in the middle of a large pasture to welcome the only graded stakes winning stallion standing at stud in Pennsylvania.

"Plans to bring this talented son of Quiet American to Pennsylvania have been in the works for several months, " according to syndicate manager,

> Tom Reigle, "We're thrilled to have him. To my knowledge, there's never been a racehorse with such accomplishments standing in Pennsylvania."

> Ten-year-old Real Quiet has sired 75 winners from 155 starters including four stakes winners in three crops, with earnings of \$3,366,205 through Septem

ber 20, 2005. The 14-member syndicate is comprised of longtime owners and breeders as well as others just etering the business with this venture. "I'm so thrilled to come into this exciting business with a share in Real Quiet", said Jenna Paglia of Princeton, NJ. "His pedigree, which includes Mr. Prospector, Dr. Fager, In Reality and Raise a Native – with all that speed, he seems like the perfect addition to the Pennsylvania breeding program."

"The future of slots will improve Pennsylvania's equine industry. Real Quiet's move to the state is a significant step in securing that future," said Mike Jester of Lancaster, PA, whose financial backing, along with others, made this move possible. "He will stand for \$6,500 for the 2006 breeding season, with a reduction to \$5,000 for mares foaling in Pennsylvania."

Real Quiet joins Reigle Heir Farms other stallions: Bankers Gold, Cats Career, Caller ID, Mazel Trick, Patton, and Roanoke.


ish in the Test Stakes at Saratoga. She could do no better than second however as Paraneck Stables "Amazing Buy", trained by Jennifer Pederson and ridden by Philly Park's leading rider Harry Vega, went gate-to-wire for the win. The 3 year old daughter of "High Yield" notched her 4th stakes score in the Oaks. The race was marred by the failure to load 9/5 second choice "Private Gift" in to the gate before starter Rusty Downes sprung the latch. It was the first in a series of frustrations for jockey Robby Albarado who was also attempting back-to-back PA Derby victories, but could no better than 7th aboard "Quadrant".

The \$75,000 Steve Van Buren Handicap, was won by one of "our own", as Anita Racing Stables "Annika Lass", under a smart ride by Danny Velazquez scored. Trained by Danny's dad, Freddie, the Florida bred daughter of Mister Jolie pushed her career earnings past \$213,000. The hard hitting gray miss was winning for the 7th time in just 13 career starts. Freddie was beaming in the winner's circle, proud of not only the fine effort by his son, but also of the 4 year old filly who has developed into one of the top female sprinters in the Mid-Atlantic. "Valley of the Gods", trained by Philly Park's own Keith LeBarron, got up for 2nd to create an "all Philly" exacta worth \$133.80!

The 2005 Derby Day will be remembered for "Sun King's" Derby win, an Oaks starter who wasn't and stakes success for Philadelphia Park horsemen. Like the weatherman said....it was a beautiful day.

# PENNSYLVANIA DAY AT THE RACES



### A CHAT ON THE BENCH

... WITH JACLYN WASILUK

Jaclyn tells me how she has been awarded the "Race for Education Scholarship". This year there were only 28 recipients out of 400 people who applied. Apparently there are two versions of the scholarship. One is the Horsemen's Scholarship, for people who are already in the industry; the other is the Thoroughbred Scholarship, for students who want to go into the industry.

I found out about the scholarship because my mom is president of the chaplaincy in Florida (chapter in Tampa). She was talking about it to someone, I guess because they contribute money. My mom organizes a bunch of fund raisers, and stuff. The scholarship is based on grades [GPA], transcripts, and three essays.

Do you live in Florida?

That's where our home is. We race at Tampa Bay Downs. Their meet runs from December to May. Then we race up here for the summer. I leave next week because I have to start school, but my parents will stay till November.

I assume you are in college right?

Yes, this is my 3rd year in school. I am majoring in elementary education. I would love to teach third grade, or second grade, or right around there. Down the road I would like to open my own daycare, probably at the racetrack. We used to go to Rockingham Park when I was real young, and they had a daycare there. That was the only one that we've ever been at, that had an organized daycare for the kids whose parents are trainers and stuff. It's really hard for the trainers to have a place to send their kids because they have such weird hours. Some of them are here from 4 in the morning till 10.

Daycare is so expensive outside... I went to Rockingham like 4 or 5 years ago and I volunteered working there. It is sponsored by the state

and the chaplaincy. So for some people it is very inexpensive. I know our neighbors, something like half their paychecks go to daycare. I just love working with the kids. Everyone says I should stay and work with the horses. It's kind of like, if you do something all your life, you want to do something else.

How long have you been in horse racing? Was it your entire life that your parents were trainers?

Yes. My parents actually met at the racetrack, and they have been together ever since. She tells me about her older brother Philip, Peter her dad, and Sharyn her mom.

How do you like college?

I like it a lot. It's different. It's hard. I like going to classes. It's different from high school. You have to be more self motivated. I like it.

Have you ever considered going on to grad school?

I would like to at least get my masters. Teachers have told me that, if you are teaching, and go back to get your masters, while you are still teaching the school will help pay for it. So you may as well, as long as you are willing to do the work.

Where do you go to school?

University of Tampa.

This scholarship is for the last 4 semesters (2 years). I don't have to reapply, as long as I keep my GPA above a 3.0, I think it is, and every semester I send them a letter to tell them about what I am doing, and how things are going and that I am still in my major.

Jaclyn tells me about how the 28 recipients of the scholarship this year had a big get together in Kentucky. They had a big weekend planned. We went to all the farms, and had a big picnic, meeting all the people. It was so awesome.

That must have been fun.

It was. It was a lot of fun. It was Friday, Saturday, Sunday, and I came back on Monday. They had stuff planned for us every day.

My brother and I joke, that as soon as we walked, our dad put a shank in our hands. When I was little, we used to just mess around roll bandages, and clean buckets. Probably when I turned 14... I was able to run horses, so I started doing that, and walking. Weekends and breaks from school my brother and I would be at the barn working.

Do you have any personal horses?

When I was in High School, I had a horse that we retired, a race horse. would ride it at a farm. She was just my play horse. I used to go out there and ride her all the time. When I went to college, I was thinking, do I have tim for to do that every day. I didn't wan to ignore her. So she's up at a farm in Florida. She's in foal with her third baby. She's my pet. Her name is Mr. Cardoon, she responds with a smile.

I like the excitement of the racing You can work with a horse, and wor with a horse, then give it to the race and watch it run. It's a competitive sport, so you have to take the good with the bad. I love the horses, an I think that is why I can't go into the business. It's because I get so emotion ally involved with the horses. Say redad gives me 5 horses to groom for summer, ... those 5 horses will be repets, and if one of them gets claimed

Her story goes on about how she grew up, and it sounds as though she has a loving family, with a good down to earth background. Having been taught to work hard for what


