If you followed my newsletter I was very optimistic about having slots in Pennsylvania.

Yes, it's now 2007, a new year of hope. Slot revenues are in place. Purses are up. All we need now is good luck and good health. Good luck is part of success.

I want to thank Michael Ballezzi, our executive director; Sal DeBunda, 1st VP; Ed Simon, statistician; Connie Youmans, board secretary and Michael Colucci, CPA, for spending many hours working together to put in place the distribution of slot revenues. This undertaking is a major job, a complicated, legal and responsible one. We are talking about millions of dollars.

Wednesday, December 13th the PTHA formally engaged Christopher McGill, president of East River Bank to assist in planning for the slots money. Your Board also retained Carl Herbein of Herbein + Company, Inc to do the state mandated audits of the gaming money used for purses and horsemen's benefits.


January 1st started the New Year with a new condition book reflecting the new increased purse structure. For the first time everyone gets paid for running. Pa breds get a 40% owner bonus, more stakes and some restricted races. What a year it is!

Here we go again. Hard Spun, an unbeaten 3 year old Pa bred won his fourth race, the \$100,000, one mile Grad III Lecomte at the Fair Grounds in New Orleans by 6 1/2 lengths with Mario Pino aboard. Congratulations to owner Rick Porter and trainer Larry Jones. Further congratulations to Unionville breeder Michael Moran and Brushwood Stable of Malvern., another exciting year for Pennsylvania breds.

I took it upon myself to write a letter of congratulations to the Honorable Edward Rendell on his re-election as Governor of Pennsylvania. I was pleased to receive a thank you letter from Governor Rendell dated December 22, 2006.

Hall of Fame trainer Grover "Buddy" Delp passed away at 74. He was the conditioner of Spectacular Bid. Bud won more than 3,600 races but Spectacular Bid's victories in the 1979 Kentucky Derby (G1), Preakness Stakes (G1) and 3rd in the Belmont Stakes (G1) made him a memorable hero. Buddy Delp blamed the loss in the Belmont on a safety pin that he pulled out of the colt's foot the morning of the race.

A - The 40% owners bonus in non-restricted races is an incentive paid through the Pennsylvania Breeders Fund. This money is added into the purse which in turn helps all aspects of the breeder program: owners and trainers with added purse money, breeders and stallion owners through breeders awards. The owners bonus also helps put a higher value on the PA bred horse. This is just one of the advantages to owning and racing a PA bred. This bonus along with the restricted race program will make future owners want to buy and race PA breds. ## Frankie Pennington Wins 256 And Breaks Record

On December 19, 2006, Frankie Pennington broke the record for number of Philadelphia Park single-season wins at 256. The 1991 record of 255 was formerly co-held by Robert Colton and Gwen Jocson. The win came on E R Blazer, trained by Jane Vaders for E & G Stables.

A former Texan, Frankie is quite happy he made Philadelphia Park home. This quiet young man says of his decision to move east, "The jockeys and all the people involved with racing here have made me feel so welcome. Everyone works together and they were really happy for my win and for

breaking the record." Frankie started his career riding for his stepfather, a trainer at Thistledown.

Frankie and his agent, former rider Bobby Martel, are both excited about the bright future of racing at Philly Park. Says Frankie, "Slots will make such a difference for everyone. Bigger purses, more fans, everyone will be happier." A 2005 apprentice winner at Philadelphia Park, Frankie, at 19 ended 2006 with 267 wins.



### Tony Galetto's Super Filly, Giovanna Gold Wins Again!

On January 6, 2007, Giovanna Gold once again brought her owner/trainer to the Winner's Circle. Tony Galetto has started his special horse 29 times with 4 wins, 4 seconds, and 4 thirds to date. She has won over \$84,000 - something spectacular for this little horse that overcame physical problems just as her best friend, Tony, has overcome skepticism and doubt from fellow trainers.

This last win for this 4 yr. old filly came at odds of 19-1 and was as thrilling as the picture portrays. What's in store for Giovanna Gold in 2007? "I'm going to just let her tell me. If she wants to race or rest, it's up to her," smiles Tony with genuine love and admiration in his eyes.

Born in New York, Tony started his career breaking yearlings and as a freelance exercise rider in Florida. His love affair with horses took hold there where he would stay in the barn and watch over the babies. His first official race as a jockey came on August 12, 1969 at Saratoga. Over the years Tony became an owner as well as an assistant for several trainers. Two years ago he took out his license and began his training career at Philadelphia Park. When asked about all the changes he's seen, this energetic horseman quickly responds, "I love everything about the slots coming to Philly Park. Where else can you have a great time with fun people and horses and make money in such a beautiful setting. I love the sights and sounds and all the glitz and glamour of the Casino too." ## "FOR 2007: GOD'S LIGHT, OR GOD'S HAND?"
