Records Fall on Pennsylvania Derby Day

Bayern took the lead from the start of this year's \$1,000,000 Pennsylvania Derby (G2) and never let up, toying with fan favorite California Chrome down the backstretch before putting away his competition en route to a 5 3/4 length victory. The three-year-old colt set a new track record for 1 1/8 miles at Parx Racing, stopping the clock in 1:34.47. The previous record was set by Selari Spirit in 1974.

In addition, handle on the day obliterated the previous all-time record of \$5,519,897 that was set just last year on Pennsylvania Derby Day, increasing by 88 percent to an astounding \$10,396,671. A crowd of over 16,000 filtered into the grandstand throughout the day so that by the time the Derby horses began entering the walking ring, the rail was jammed with excited spectators.

"That was just a powerful performance. (Bayern) broke well and they let us go and (jockey) Martin (Garcia) hustled to get away from California Chrome," praised winning trainer Bob Baffert. "When Bayern runs like that, nobody's going to beat him."

Bayern is a son of Offlee Wild, out of the Thunder Gulch mare Alittlebitearly. He was purchased by Kaleem Shah, Inc. as a juvenile for \$320,000 at the

Untapable Unstoppable in Cotillion

In the \$1,000,000 Cotillion Stakes (G1), what was supposed to decide the sophomore filly championship turned into a runaway, as Kentucky Oaks heroine Untapable and rider Rosie Napravnik blew by their rivals to win by an easy length. The daughter of Tapit rebounded from a disappointing performance against the boys in the G1 Haskell Invitational...

"I was extremely pleased to have her back in the winner's circle," said trainer Steve Asmussen. "I think a lot of little things added up to (the Haskell) not being her day. I was very proud that she came out of a tough race like that, tough circumstances, to win her third Grade 1 of the year."

Favorite Tale Romps in **Gallant Bob**

Local colt Favorite Tale kept his Parx record intact at a perfect four-for-four in winning the Gallant Bob Stakes (G3). The three-year-old gelded son of Tale of the Cat drew off down the stretch, defeating heavy favorite Fast Anna, who most recently was nipped at the wire in the G1 King's Bishop at Saratoga.

Favorite Tale finished the six furlongs in an incredibly quick 1:08.16. He is trained by Guadalupe Preciado for Paul Conaway's PJG Stable. John Bisono continued his dominance of local stakes races with the victory aboard Favorite Tale.

Preciado was all smiles after the Gallant Bob, noting, "It was a tough race, nice horses, but we're home. He never lost on this track yet. There's nothing like being home."

Homebred Favorite Tale is out of a half-sister to Favorite Trick, the 1997 Horse of the Year and Champion Two-Year-Old Colt.



Margano Takes PTHA President's Cup



Hall of Fame Day at Parx Racing was highlighted by a dramatic finish in the \$250,000 PTHA President's Cup. The race unfolded easily enough until the stretch run, as Lael Stable's Margano and Augustin Stable's Holiday Star drove to the wire. Holiday Star took a short lead, but Margano gallantly fought back. In the end, the photo determined that Margano had flashed under the wire by the tiniest of margins. The PTHA President's Cup was the second stakes win for Margano, who was trained by Arnaud Delacour and ridden by Kendrick Carmouche.

Edge of Reality Claims Alphabet Soup

In the very first stakes event on the biggest day of racing in Pennsylvania history, last year's Parx Racing three-year-old champion male, Edge of Reality, took the \$100,000 Alphabet Soup Handicap on the turf. The son of Lawyer Ron was ridden by Irad Ortiz, Jr. for trainer Graham Motion and owner the Elkstone Group LLC.

On Saturday, September 13th, Parx Racing and the PTHA inducted nine outstanding individuals into the Parx Racing Hall of Fame. This marked the first year that a full race day was dedicated to the ceremonies, and it was a huge success. Kate DeMasi, Chairman of the Hall of Fame Committee, noted, "This allowed us to give a proper acknowledgement to each inductee and truly feature the event as a headliner, rather than as a side note to the Pennsylvania Derby card."

In this fourth year of inductions, three horses, two owners, one trainer, one jockey, and two special achievement awards were presented to some of Parx Racing's most accomplished individuals. More photos and full biographies of each honoree may be found on the PTHA website, www.patha.org.

Steven Appel, DDS



Dr. Steven Appel went to the track for the first time at age 16, and promptly hit the daily double for \$120. He was stunned: he had just worked an entire summer as a camp counselor, and he made his entire summer salary in 30 minutes. In December of 1979, he took the first \$1,500 he saved and bought a horse named Way to Peace, and he has been hooked on the sport ever since. Dr. Appel is a well-known local orthodontist, and he named his Wire to Wire Stables by merging the two passions of his life. He still gets just as excited for a low-level claimer he he does for a stakes race. His best horse was fellow Hall of Fame inductee Whistle Pig.

Fifteen years ago, Jack Armstrong never would have thought that he would be the third-leading owner in wins and second-leading owner in money earned at Parx Racing. In fact, at that time he wasn't even a horse owner. After experiencing a day at the races with a co-worker who owned a racehorse, Armstrong decided to give the horse racing business a try, and the rest is history. He has since been crowned leading owner at Parx three times, and finished second by just a single victory in a fourth year.



Philip Aristone



With Phil Aristone's induction this year, he and his father Roland became the first father-son duo to enter the Hall of Fame. Aristone, who is the third all-time leading trainer and money-earner at Parx, entered the horse racing industry with the encouragement of his brother Menotti, who was a jockey. He has snapped up two Parx training titles while staying consistently within the top five trainers over the past decade, and now has his sights set on 1,500 career victories.



Broad Brush was undefeated at Philadelphia Park in a career that included a stunning victory in the G2 Pennsylvania Derby after bolting on the final turn.



Roamin Rachel broke her maiden by an impressive 8 1/2 lengths at Philadelphia Park en route to a career that matched her against the best females of her class.



Whistle Pig earned just shy of \$1 million the hard way, and the majority of his starts were right here in his home state of Pennsylvania.

Jockey Victor Molina has been living his childhood dream since 1980, after he finished high school. He credits trainer Sydney Watters, Jr. with paving the way for future success by supporting him early in his career, as well as his former agent David Anderson. In 1992, Molina made history by becoming the first local rider to win the Pennsylvania Derby (G2) aboard Thelastcrusade. He is a leading voice and an inspiration to young riders in the Parx jockey colony.



Michael Ballezzi, Esq



Michael Ballezzi is a crucial leader of the PTHA, of which he was appointed Executive Director in 1996. He has made a personal commitment to all Parx horsemen that he will always be the strongest voice in the racing industry for their rights, so that all horsemen will be on a fair and level playing field. A significant part of his tenure with the PTHA so far has been the passage of Act 71 in Harrisburg. Ballezzi's advocacy has spanned the gamut from purse distribution, live racing days, stall allocation, medication rules, pension benefits, health care, backside improvements, racehorse retirement, and more.

When you live in Kentucky, there are two major pasttimes: college basketball and horse racing. That was no different for Bruce Casella, who went to college just minutes from Keeneland, and it was there that he fell in love with the sport of kings. It quickly became his career goal to promote horse racing by utilizing his degree in communications. In 1992, Casella joined forces with PTHA President Salvatore DeBunda to create *Let's Go Racing*, and recently pitched coverage of the Pennsylvania Derby and Cotillion Stakes to the Comcast Network, a program that has brought national attention to Parx Racing.

Turning for Home Stakes

A deluge of rain took the \$75,000 Turning for Home Stakes off the turf on Owners Appreciation Day, resulting in the contest scratching down to a match race. Unfortunately, the wet footing sent Change of Command to his nose coming out of the starting gate, and while rider Frankie Pennington was able to get his mount back into the race for a short time, it was

simply too much to overcome.

Seven-year-old gelding Hobo Ridge romped by 24 lengths for Parx trainer Marcos Zulueta and owner M-Z Racing Partnership, sending that team to the winner's circle in a stakes race for the very first time. Hobo Ridge was ridden to victory by Angel Castillo.









In the \$300,000 Smarty Jones S (G3), Protonico roared down the stretch to snatch the event in the final hundred yards of the race. The 3yo son of Giant's Causeway overcame a rough trip under Joe Bravo for owner International Equities Holding, Inc. The victory marked trainer Todd Pletcher's 1,000th stakes win.

Finishing a gallant second behind Protonico was local horse Classic Giacnroll (below center), owned by Joseph Bender and Lisa Guerrero, who also serves as trainer of the Triple Crown-nominated colt.







GREENWOOD CUP



Cary Street slipped through on the rail en route to an easy victory in the \$200,000 Greenwood Cup (G3). The 5yo son of Smarty Jones was ridden by Miguel Mena, trained by Brendan Walsh, and owned by JBL Thoroughbreds LLC & Walsh Racing LLC.

Local Ever Rider (ARG) ran a game second. The gray (below right) was recently purchased by Waldorf Racing Stables and placed in the care of trainer Marya Montoya. In addition to the Greenwood Cup, Ever Rider has rewarded his new connections with a win at Saratoga.













Quality Lass overcame a long wait after Aquinnah (below second from right) broke through the gate, then held off a late charge by Joya Real to win the \$200,000 Turf Amazon for owner West Point Thoroughbreds, trainer Guadalupe Preciado (below right), and jockey John Bisono.

Quality Lass was in apparent distress from the heat upon reaching the winner's circle, but for those who were concerned about her health, we are happy to report that she has recovered and is doing just fine.

One of the biggest draws for the day was Kentucky Derby and Preakness hero California Chrome, who was making his first start since his failed Triple Crown attempt in June. The chestnut colt was the first Kentucky Derby winner to race at the Bensalem track, and that did not go unnoticed by fans and horsemen alike. California Chrome essentially had a target on his back for the other jockeys.

"The other riders, they worried about me, they didn't worry about the one in the front (Bayern), and I knew I was in trouble in the first turn," said jockey Victor Espinoza after California Chrome faded to a disappointing

sixth place finish.

Tapiture, under rider Rosie Napravnik, closed late to finish second, a head in front of G2 winner Candy Boy, which was reminiscent of their nose of separation in the West Virginia Derby (G2) in August.

California Chrome's trainer Art Sherman was contemplative after the race, noting that his colt might have needed a race. Sherman said, "Now that he has a race under his belt, he'll be a lot stronger. We'll bring him home and get him ready for the Breeders' Cup."

Untapable is a homebred for Winchell Thoroughbreds, out of their Grade 2-winning Prized mare, Fun House. The threeyear-old bay filly by Tapit had been a sensation against female competition earlier in the year, destroying her competition in four races by an average of nearly eight lengths. Her smallest margin of victory occurred in the Kentucky Oaks by over four lengths.

After breaking through the starting gate in the minutes leading up to the Cotillion, Sweet Reason closed late to catch pacesetter Jojo Warrior for second. Sweet Reason was coming off two straight two straight Grade 1 victories in New York, where she swept past the field in the final strides. However, the Street Sense filly met her match on Cotillion Day with the tenacity of Untapable.

Repole Stable's Stopchargingmaria scratched on the morning of the Cotillion, which was a disappointment, as the filly was also exiting back-to-back Grade 1 wins, including a victory in the Alabama Stakes over the John Servis trainee, Joint Return, who also contested the Cotillion. Swilcan Stables' Vero Amore had also recently run second behind Stopchargingmaria in the Grade 2 Black Eyed Susan on Preakness Day, and Vero Amore was back for the Cotillion as well. Unfortunately, neither filly was able to hit the board, finishing sixth and seventh.

Untapable finished the 1/16th miles in 1:42.71 over a fast track.

Parx Trainers Nearly Sweep Stakes on Breeders' Day

Pennsylvania's Day at the Races, presented by the Pennsylvania Horse Breeders Association, turned into a thrilling afternoon as Parx horsemen really held their own against some stiff competition.

In the first of five stakes events, Vince Campanella's **Aunt Ellipsis** rallied to win the \$75,000 Dr. Teresa Garofalo Memorial Stakes. The three-year-old daughter of Successful Appeal sat three lengths off a pair of dueling front runners with a half mile to go and then ran past a tired Disco Chick inside the eighth pole to win by just under two lengths at the finish. It was the second stakes win of her career for trainer Keith LeBarron. She was ridden by Inoel Beato. Aunt Ellipsis is out of the Gulch mare Aunt Dot Dot.

The biggest purse of the day belonged to the \$100,000 Mrs. Penny Stakes. Augustin Stable's **Appealing Cat** sat a perfect trip on the inside rail before rider Eriluis Vaz pointed her through a hole in midstretch en route to a solid victory. Appealing Cat was part of an even money entry trained by Graham Motion. The five-year-old Successful Appeal mare followed in her dam's footsteps with the Mrs. Penny win - Dynamic Cat won the 2005 renewal of the same race.

The \$75,000 Marshall Jenney Handicap turned into an absolute thriller. Kate DeMasi trainee **Merry's Honor**, expertly ridden by John Bisono, threaded through stretch traffic to snatch a dramatic four-horse photo. The winning ownership group was Pewter Stable, who also campaigned her dam, the multiple stakes-winning mare Merry Princess.

Bisono took his second stakes victory of the day in the \$75,000 Roanoke Stakes when he guided **Traffic Light** to the wire four lengths in front. The gelded son of Peace Rules led from the onset, turned back all challengers on the final turn, and drew away down the stretch in an easy win for trainer Freddy Velazquez. The victory propelled Traffic Light's career earnings over the half-million dollar mark for owner John Trippi.

The \$75,000 Banjo Picker Sprint produced a heart-stopping finish that came down to the last few strides. Inside the final furlong, four horses charged to the wire, bearing down with all of their might. However, it was the late-running **Rustler Hustler**, who sent two young Parx horsemen to the winner's circle for their very first stakes victories - trainer Marya Montoya and jockey Jorge Vargas, Jr. The son of Ecton Park rewarded owner Waldorf Racing Stables LLC with the win.



What Ever Happened to PA Derby Winners...?

... MACHO UNO

Pennsylvania Derby (G3) - September 3, 2001

When Macho Uno won the 2000 Breeders' Cup Juvenile en route to an Eclipse Award as Champion Juvenile Colt, the "Breeders' Cup Juvenile Curse" was still in full effect. The handsome gray colt, trained by Joe Orseno and owned by Stronach Stables, was bothered by ankle problems throughout his sophomore season, and by the time he entered the starting gate for the G3 Pennsylvania Derby, he had only made one start in 2001. That ended up not making a difference, as Macho Uno blew by all his competition at the eighth pole and pulled away to a length and a half victory.

Macho Uno ran through 2002, winning an allowance and the G2 Massachusetts Handicap, before retiring to Frank Stronach's Adena Springs Farm in Paris, Kentucky. Macho Uno is a half-brother to Breeders' Cup Classic winner Awesome Again, and by National Hall of Fame member Holy Bull. Since entering stud in 2003, Macho Uno has sired five Grade 1 winners, including Mucho Macho Man, who won the 2013 Breeders' Cup Classic. He is also the sire of Private Zone, two-time winner of the G1 Vosburgh Stakes, who set a new stakes record for six furlongs last year and won in 2014 for Freddy Velazquez.



... MORNING LINE

Pennsylvania Derby (G2) - September 25, 2010

Morning Line was just coming into his own when trainer Nick Zito entered the son of Tiznow in the G2 Pennsylvania Derby. He was exiting a scintillating, eleven-length score at Saratoga for owner Thoroughbred Legends Racing Stable. After setting the pace in the PA Derby and being caught in mid-stretch by First Dude and A Little Warm, Morning Line found an almost impossible second gear, and coming back with one last burst of speed to take the race by a fraught neck.

Morning Line vaulted to the top of his class after the PA Derby of 2010, becoming an elite miler who was versatile enough to shorten up or stretch out depending upon where he ran. He finished second in the G1 Breeders' Cup Dirt Mile in his very next race after the PA Derby, and won the G1 Carter Handicap at Aqueduct as well as the G2 Mervyn LeRoy Handicap at Hollywood Park.

At the conclusion of his six-year-old season, Morning Line was retired to Lane's End Farm in Versailles, KY. This past spring was his first year at stud.



Chaplain Rick Bunker

"For what profit is it to a man if he gains the whole world, and loses his own soul? Or what will a man give in exchange for his soul?"

- Matthew 16:26 (NKJU)



How precious and valuable you are! Let us in the little space we have here draw this one point from the text above. If it is of no profit for anyone to gain even the whole world in exchange for his or her soul – how special are each and every one of you!

Has someone, anyone, ever told you otherwise? How authoritative are their opinions in comparison to that of Holy Scripture? The Bible is saying that you are worth more than all the treasures of the whole world. If there were two people sitting on a bench, there would be more value there than twice the value of this entire planet – more!

Do you ask how it is that you are so valuable? For one thing you are one of a kind. There is no one who is just like you. I believe that what we call the most ordinary person is an amazing and fantastic wonder. Have you ever considered that God has created you so that there never has been another you? 


