

## Record Support on Turning for Home Day'16

## PA Derby Bonus Looks to Attract Triple Crown Winners

Over the past half-decade, the \$1 million Pennsylvania Derby (G2) has grown into a premiere fall event for some of the best three-year-olds in the country. Beginning with future multiple Grade 1 winner and stakes record-holder To Honor and Serve in 2011, the PA Derby has drawn an impressive roster of horses, including 2014 Kentucky Derby (and future Dubai World Cup) hero California Chrome, who finished fourth behind Bayern, who used the PA Derby as a springboard prep for his exciting victory in his next start - the \$5 million Breeders' Cup Classic. Will Take Charge captured the 2013 PA Derby en route to being crowned that year's Eclipse Award for top three-year-old male. And of course last year fans saw Frosted

vault out of American Pharoah's shadow, winning under a hand ride and showing a spark of the brilliance he has exhibited as a four-year-old this year (Frosted won the G1 Met Mile by more than 14 lengths before winning the G1 Whitney Handicap in his most recent start at Saratoga).

This year's PA Derby is looking to attract yet another group of outstanding sophomores, and is doing so in a big way, as track management has implemented a structure of total purse bonuses. Three different colts captured the three Triple Crown races this spring and

Recently, the PSHRC unfortunately had to table necessary corrections to the recently enacted breeding fund legislation because of legal limitations, but the PSHRC sent a letter to the legislative leadership urging the legislature to act quickly to restore the original funding language and study later what changes, if any, can be made to enhance breeding in Pennsylvania.

## **Parx Racing Roundup**

#### DONALD LEVINE MEMORIAL STAKES



Defending champion A. P. Indian made easy work of the \$100,000 Donald LeVine Memorial Stakes, held at Parx Racing on June 18. The imposing son of Indian Charlie completed the seven furlongs nearly a full second faster than last year, while leading wire-to-wire under a masterful hand ride by Joe Bravo. A. P. Indian is undefeated in 2016 for trainer Arnaud Delacour, including two scintillating Grade 1 victories at Saratoga. He is a homebred for Green Lantern Stables, LLC, and is out of multiple stakes winner Ender's Sister, who was most recently a \$725,000 RNA at the 2008 Keeneland November Sale while in foal to Distorted Humor.

TURNING FOR HOME STAKES

Encryption kept his perfect record at Parx Racing intact with a hard-fought victory over favored Majestic Affair in the \$100,000 Turning for Home Stakes on June 25. The Exchange Rate colt captured the \$150,000 Bayern Stakes on PA Derby Day last year by an emphatic 6 1/4 lengths after pressing the pace throughout, defeating a strong field of eight for his first stakes win. The Turning for Home Stakes required a different tactic, as jockey Nik Juarez settled the five-year-old behind the leaders before swinging wide into the final turn en route to a neck victory. Kelly Breen trains for owner Stoneway Farm, who purchased Encryption as a yearling for \$140,000 at the

Keeneland September Yearling Sale. He was bred by Greenwood Lodge Farm in Kentucky and is out of the stakes-winning Bahri mare Mystic Soul.

#### DR. JAMES PENNY MEMORIAL STAKES

The first graded stakes event of the year went to Empyrean Stables' Zipessa, as Florent Geroux guided the daughter of City Zip to an easy two-length win on the Fourth of July. Michael Stidham trains Zipessa, who captured her first career stakes win in the Grade 3, \$200,000 Dr. James Penny Memorial Stakes. Zipessa was bred in

Kentucky by G. Watts Humphrey, Jr., and Sally S. Humphrey.

#### STEEPLECHASE RACING AT PARX

Barbara's Smile beat the boys in an allowance race over hurdles on July 12 at Parx Racing. The five-year-old Curlin mare sat just off the pace set by King Ting (IRE) for the first mile and three-quarters before passing him with ease under a careful ride by Mark Watts.

#### POWER BY FAR STAKES

In the first of two stakes for Pennsylvania-Breds on July 23, Fat Kat demolished her competitors in the \$100,000 Power by Far Stakes, a five-furlong turf sprint for fillies and mares. It was the first career stakes win for Fat Kat, who is trained by Robert Reid, Jr., for owners L and C Racing LLC, Squire Thoroughbreds LLC and Wake The Dame. Fat Kat is a five-year-old daughter of Weigelia who was bred by Wynoaks Farm, LLC & St. Omers Farm.

#### CROWD PLEASER STAKES

Nearly all of Saratoga Jack's connections earned their first career stakes wins with his emphatic 5 3/4-length victory in the \$100,000 Crowd Pleaser Stakes on July 23, including owner Jean Mahoney, trainer Miguel Vera, and breeders Kate Goldenberg & Helen Boynton. Saratoga Jack is by Emperor Tiberius, out of the Williamstown mare Thinkoutsidethebox.



One June 29, 2016, the Pennsylvania State Horse Racing Commission (PSHRC) amended the Administrative Code of 1929 (P.L. 177, No. 175). More commonly known as the "Racing Act", this measure permits the PSHRC to license all trainers, drivers, horse owners, vendors and all other persons participating in horse racing.

The PSHRC consolidated the license classifications and all previously established occupational license fees prior to February 23, 2016, including no longer distinguishing by breed of racehorse. All new fees took affect as of July 1, 2016 and supersede all previous fee schedules individually approved or issued by the former State Horse and State Harness Racing Commissions respectively. Unless otherwise noted, license fees are valid for three years. Fingerprinting may be required and if so, a requisite fingerprint processing fee will be additional.

#### Remembering Former PTHA President Larry Riviello

Lawrence Riviello, Sr., passed away on June 10, 2016 at the age of 88. He graduated from Upper Darby High School and subsequently majored in Marketing and Business

Administration at Temple University. An owneroperator of restaurants since 1949, he owned Larry's Luncheonette in Upper Darby, the Cafeteria at The Bazaar of All Nations, and Rite Buy Beer Corporation in Clifton Heights.

Riviello raced at Parx as LaBet, Inc. and had been involved in the breeding and ownership of Thoroughbreds since 1965. Elected as the Vice-President of the National Horsemen's Benevolence and Protective Association twice, he was named their Man of the Year in 1989.

During the years that Riviello served the PTHA, he and the Board of Directors worked together to gain a new first floor, new director's room, horsemen's cafe, clubhouse with box seats, sports bar, Cotillion Room, and newly renovated paddock and walking ring. They also successfully negotiated the repeal of a 6% sales tax, the no live racing – no simulcasting live racing agreement, guarantee of due process and arbitration by contract, as well as establishing trophy and blanket races for owners.

A highlight of his Presidency was when Governor Ed Rendell signed the Gaming Bill, House Bill 2330,

on July 5, 2004, which permitted slot machines at Pennsylvania racetracks. Riviello retired in 2007 after serving eight terms as PTHA President.

Parx Racing would like the whole trio to make the trip to Bensalem for its premiere event.

"If all three run, the purse will be raised by \$500,000 to \$1.5 million," said Director of Racing Sam Elliott, who has been regularly speaking with the horses' connections this summer. "If two of the three run, the purse will be revised \$250,000 to \$1.25 million. All three have expressed interest."

The \$1 million, Grade 1 Cotillion will also be contested on PA Derby Day. It is expected that the undefeated, sensational filly Songbird will draw a big crowd, but she will likely face a formidable local competitor - John Servis's Kentucky Oaks (G1) heroine Cathryn Sophia. Elliott recently added the \$150,000 Princess of Sylmar Stakes on September 3rd

as a prep for Cathryn Sophia and the filly is expected to make her fall debut there.

"We're looking forward to it," said Servis upon the race announcement. "We hope all goes well up to that point, but it gives us a chance to get a race over the track before the Cotillion."

## **SMARTY JONES**

# Chaplain's Corner Chaplain Rick Bunker

'15 The eyes of the LORD *are* on the righteous, And His ears *are open* to their cry.

The righteous cry out, and the LORD hears, And delivers them out of all their troubles.

<sup>18</sup> The LORD is near to those who have a broken heart, And saves such as have a contrite spirit.

<sup>19</sup> Many are the afflications of the righteous, But the LORD delivers him out of them all."

- Psalm 34:15-19 (NKJU)

"Life is difficult." Those three words make up the complete first sentence of M. Scott Peck's book *The Road Less Traveled*. The passage above makes a similar assertion – "Many are the afflictions of the righteous." The Bible never misrepresents reality. It tells the truth. Thankfully the truth continues by clarifying that though the report that a life of many afflictions is normative, "the LORD delivers [us] from them all."

It would have been an especially great and disruptive shame if the truck had been repossessed with so little remaining. Our assistance gave this person a chance to catch up. They would have been in worse trouble if the truck had been lost.

It is an honor when we are able to be conduits through which blessings can flow. It is only by the support of many of you that these blessings the Chaplaincy shares are able to be given – thank you. It is your continued support that will allow these benevolences to continue.

It is not easy to share and give when we know that the future is sure to be challenging. Take and practice faith by sharing of your treasure, time, and talents; and know that this will allow you to be entrusted with even more. It is when we are faithful and because we are faithful that the LORD is willing to entrust us with even more.
