A Night of Celebration for Parx Horsemen

2016 Parx Racing Champions Crowned

The PTHA partnered with Parx Racing on March 29, 2017 to honor the top horsemen and their equine athletes from 2016. Attendees were ecstatic for the return to Celebrations, a stunningly elegant venue located just up the road from Parx Racing's stable gate entrance. A sold out crowd of nearly 300 people enjoyed an evening of cocktails, hors d'oeurves, dinner and dancing.

Headlining the evening as 2016 Parx Racing Horse of the Year was Disco Chick, who captured two of three starts at Parx including the \$100,000 My Juliet Stakes and \$100,000 Foxy J G Stakes. Disco Chick is owned by Yaroslaw "Jerry" Kolybabiuk and also received the award for Champion Older Female.

The leading horsemen at Parx set incredible records in 2016. Patricia Farro earned the Leading Trainer title for the second time in her career, winning 97 races with an astounding 70 *different* horses. Frankie Pennington successfully defended his Leading Jockey title, while Luis Ocasio was able to add the Leading Apprentice

Jockey award at Parx Racing to the Eclipse Award on his mantle. Leading Owner went to Marshall Gramm's Ten Strike Racing, while Morris E. Kernan, Jr. earned Leading "Division B" Owner. Miguel Penaloza took home the honors for Leading "Division B" Trainer.

Also capturing awards were A Fleet Attitude (Claiming Horse of the Year & Outstanding Claim of the Year), Broadway Bay (Winningest Horse), Downhill Racer (2yo Male), Ms Locust Point (2yo Female), Abiding Star (3yo Male), Trace of Grace (3yo Female), and Duval (Older Male).

President's Message Salvatore M. DeBunda, Esq.

Yet again, it is the most crucial time of year for horsemen, as we continue the never-ending battle with

legislators to protect the Race Horse Development Fund (RHDF) going into fiscal year 2017-2018. Earlier this month, I testified at the Pennsylvania

House of Representatives' Gaming Oversight Committee meeting in Bensalem, during which committee members discussed the possibility of expanded gaming in the state. I wanted to share with you some highlights, so that you can fully understand what is at stake.

"As you know, when the Race Horse Development and Gaming Act - Act 71 - was enacted, an assessment, not a tax, was agreed to by track operators to offset the negative impact additional gaming (slots) would have on the well-established equine racing program within Pennsylvania. *It is very important that I make this point. NOT ONE DIME OF TAXPAYER DOLLARS GOES TO THE RHDF. NOT ONE.* I state this in the strongest terms possible because some, in the legislature and elsewhere, have stated the opposite and they are simply wrong.

"In fact, since 2009, the RHDF has been raided to help solve the chronic structural deficit issues facing PA. Since that year, over \$300 million has been diverted from the Fund . . . to help balance the General Fund. . . In total, the horsemen and breeders have seen over \$325 million originally purposed for Race Horse Development diverted to other uses. This fiscal year we saw an additional \$25.759 million diverted to help fund the Racing Commissions, the equine testing program, and . . . the fairs, farm show, Animal Health lab and Penn Vet School.

"Now we look at the prospect of significant expansion of gaming options and see the likelihood that slots play will diminish through a . . . plethora of additional . . . gaming options for consumers. We forsee a future where the operator assessments for the equine racing program will continue to decline while the diversion of funds from a significantly reduced RHDF will continue to increase. This combination of events will result in:

- limiting the health & pension programs provided to trainers, jockeys & other racing personnel,
- · dramatically reducing the likelihood of investment within the Commonwealth for breeding facilities, and
- lowering the number of jobs related to the care & training of our equine athletes as fewer horses will race within the state.
- ". . . Our equine racing industry is deeply rooted within Pennsylvania's agriculture and tourism industries. It provides over 23,000 Pennsylvanians with family sustaining jobs and helps to preserve thousands of acres of farmland for pasture and feed production. . . It is through the disbursement of purse winnings and breeder awards . . . that the economic benefit of our Race Horse Development and Gaming Act of 2004 benefits more than just a few host communities and counties. In fact, the Joint State Government Commission (staff study of Horse Racing in Pennsylvania) noted that the casino assessment of \$232 million to the RHDF resulted in over \$389 million in economic activity and benefit for the Commonwealth."

The morning after this crucial meeting, the PTHA gave a group of these committee members, including Committee Chairman, Rep. Scott Petri, a tour of the Parx Racing backstretch, showcasing the fact that our racetrack is about more than just horses and gambling.

On a lighter note, I would like to express my heartfelt congratulations to our 2016 Horsemen's Awards recipients, especially Horse of the Year Disco Chick. We were also able to recognize some of our outstanding horsemen. Congratulations again to all involved!

Our very own Turning for Home was recently honored with a proclamation from the Pennsylvania House of Representatives. House Resolution H60, congratulating Turning for Home on the safe retirement of 2,000 horses, was passed unanimously. A similar decision was also passed in the Senate, and their own proclamation will be presented on Saturday, June 24, 2017 - our 4th Annual Turning for Home Day. Please be sure to mark that date on your calendar, as it will be another exciting day at the races, filled with many success stories. I look forward to seeing you there!

PA Gaming Oversight Committee Visits Parx Racing

On Wednesday, April 12, 2017, members of the Pennsylvania House of Representatives' Gaming Oversight Committee attended a meeting at Parx Racing to receive testimony regarding local share assessment, gaming expansion and casino competitiveness.

While in Bensalem, the group also gathered the following morning for a tour of Parx Racing's back-stretch, where they not only were able to watch morning training but also hear first-hand accounts

about the industry from actual horsemen, including PTHA President Sal DeBunda, PTHA Executive Director Mike Ballezzi, PTHA Board Member & Parx-based trainer Butch Reid, Turning for Home Program Administrator Danielle Montgomery, veterinarian Dr. Al Reed, and Parx Racing Hall of Fame jockey Frankie Pennington. The experience was eye-opening for several Commissioners, who were truly able to see just how many people are affected by the horse racing industry.



Parx Racing to Host 4th Annual Jockeys & Jeans



Parx Racing will host the fourth Jockeys & Jeans event during the races on Saturday, June 3, a week before the Belmont Stakes.

Event proceeds benefit the Permanently Disabled Jockeys Fund (PDJF), which makes monthly payments to over 60 former jockeys who suffered catastrophic, career-ending injuries. Over half of recipients are either pari- or quadriplegics. In three years, Jockeys & Jeans has raised nearly \$650,000 for PDJF.

"Once again, a major racing facility has come forward to provide the infrastructure and personnel needed to honor and financially assist severely injured riders and at the same time provide their fans with the rare opportunity to meet our sport's most storied athletes," said the group's President, former jockey, Barry Pearl. "We believe that Parx Racing's participation, along with the heart-touching response we have received from the racing community, will allow us to top the record \$235,000 we raised last winter at Gulfstream Park."

"Parx Racing is honored to be hosting Jockeys & Jeans this coming June," said Parx Racing COO Joe Wilson. "Barry and his team have made great strides with their event to benefit the PDJF and we look forward to building on that momentum with them."

The 2016 Jockeys & Jeans event attracted 14 Hall of Fame jockeys and a host of other famous riders along with Academy Award winner Robert Duvall, Hall of Fame golfer Raymond Floyd and former ambassador to England, Will Farish and his wife, Sarah. The couple founded Lane's End Farm, which in 2016 led a large group of stallion season owners who contributed seasons that added \$130,000 to funds raised for that event.

This year the organization expects to attract as many as 17 Hall of Fame Jockeys such as Laffit Pincay, Jr. Manny Ycaza, Chris McCarron, Pat Day, John Rotz, Bill Boland and Edgar Prado, as well as six Fallen Riders and local favorite Sam Boulmetis.

Jockeys & Jeans was founded in 2014 by a group of former jockeys to publicize the dangers inherent in race riding and honor the courage of severely injured jockeys as they rebuild their abruptly-changed lives, as well as raise funds for their ongoing support.

This positive public recognition advances the PTHA's mission to protect our racing industry in Pennsylvania.

Follow-up on alumni is just as easy, as Kelly is in regular contact with all of her adopters. Student Groups Visit Parx Racing

Scandinavia is a hub within the harness racing world, with Sweden hosting the most prestigious international trotting event in the world, the Elitloppet (G1) - "The Elite Race" - each year. Some of the world's greatest equestrians hail from the region, which also includes Denmark, Finland, Greenland, Iceland and Norway.

Every spring, a group of young Scandinavian equestrian students travel to the United States. The girls attend the Asane Folkehogskole, which is a boarding school located in Bergen, Norway. It offers a number of unique curriculums, including music,

theater, art, writing, game design, and equestrian studies. The school is located just minutes from Bergen Trotting Park, giving students the opportunity to work directly with professional horsemen on a regular basis.

When the students arrive in the United States for their two-week educational field trip, one of the highlights is always a stop at Parx Racing. 2017 marked the ninth straight year that the girls have visited the Bensalem track, thanks to the assistance of pony rider Brandy Steenson, who works with the school's Equestrian Manager Marianne Kaarevik to make the trip successful.



EVERYTHING LITTLE FARM

The Beers family (Donna, Bill, Kelsey and Brad) founded Everything Little Farm in 2009, and specialize in young children (starting as young as 3 years old). The students learn everything about horses, not just how to ride their ponies, so they have a true understanding of what it means to be a horseman. The farm is located in Bedminster, PA and has taught hundreds of young riders.

On Saturday, April 15, 2017, a group of 30 students (not including parents - and these kids were just

from the farm's leadership group!) were able to visit Parx Racing for a Day at the Races. In addition, the students met in the PTHA's board room where they heard from many industry professionals, including PTHA Executive Director Mike Ballezzi, Chief PA State Veterinarian Dr. Craig Goldblatt, and trainers Randy Allen and Kate DeMasi.

The students also learned about off-track Thoroughbreds from Turning for Home Program Administrator Danielle Montgomery, and they even donated their own pocket money as well as handmade cards for Turning for Home's horses!


Our Condolences . . .





Chaplain's Corner Chaplain Rick Bunker

"In the beginning God created the heavens and the earth."

- Genesis 1:1 (N(U)

In the beginning – who came up with the idea of a beginning first, the Bible or science? It wasn't until the 1960s that scientific evidence started coming in that there was an origin to space/ time (the expansion of the universe, microwave background, etc.). There was great resistance to this evidence and the reason very often given was it would give too much leverage to those who believe the Bible. Here was the biggest advance in astrophysics and cosmology in the 20th century being resisted because it paralleled Scripture. Many believe if more scientists had kept their minds open to the Biblical Worldview instead of being so wedded to Aristotle's eternal universe, we might have found this evidence much earlier, and many other discoveries as well.

Now what about this beginning resulting in God creating everything? "The heavens and the earth" is a merism that refers to *everything*. The God of the Bible is not a "god of the gaps". "God created the heavens and the earth" doesn't mean God created the bits we don't understand, and once I understand, for instance, what thunder is, that gets rid of the god of thunder. It means to say that the God of the Bible created everything.

As we do explain more and more, should this cause one to consider it irrational, or delusional to believe in God, as some have written? Should a move from theism to atheism be considered natural progress based on current explanations and discoveries? Well - what do scientific discoveries explain?

Ludwig Wittgenstein wrote, "The great delusion of modernity, is that the laws of nature explain

the universe for us. The laws of nature describe the universe, they describe the regularities. But they explain nothing."

Even Newton, who taught us so much about gravity, said, "I have no idea what gravity is."

In the more famous quote of Saint Augustine, he says, "What then is time? If no one asks me, I know what it is. If I wish to explain it to him who asks, I do not know."

There are different ways of explaining an event. Scientific explanations deal with laws and mechanism. If someone asks why the water is boiling, I could give a simple scientific explanation that I had put it on heat and it heated the water to the point that the water molecules were moving so fast that the water was boiling. I could also give a personal explanation that deals with agency and say, "I wanted a cup of tea." Neither answer contradicts the other; they complement each other.

The more we understand of the universe, the more we understand the God who did it that way. Just as the more someone learns about art, the more they will admire and enjoy a Rembrandt. The more someone understands engineering, the more she can admire a turbo fan jet.

My hope is that as we enjoy the season of spring and all the new life that comes with the season, you will be filled with wonder at the power and beauty of this creation. You are the crown of creation and may you be filled with optimism in knowing that the same God who created you also loves you and values you more than all of the rest of creation.


