The Man IS The Man at Parx in 2017

The PTHA partnered with Parx Racing on March 28, 2018 to honor the top horsemen and their equine athletes from 2017. Over 300 guests attended the event, which in addition to the awards included cocktails, hors d'oeurves and dinner.


The event was also a way to honor the sudden and heartbreaking death of Parx Racing's all-time leading money-earning jockey, Jose Flores, who passed away after a racing accident on March 19. Horsemen were able to come together to comfort each other in this terrible time of sadness and several raffles raised money for the PTHA's Flores Family Fund.

"While we gather tonight to celebrate, we also do so with hearts heavy with the loss of one of the most loved, most respected members of family, jockey Jose Flores," noted Keith Jones during the banquet. "But while we are all filled with that terrible sadness, loss and finality that death brings, we can at least take some small measure of solace in the fact that we were lucky enough to cross paths with such a wonderful human being."

Headlining the evening as the 2017 Parx Racing Horse of the Year was The Man, who was undefeated in six starts last year. Trained by John Servis for Natalie J.

Baffert and Bernard C. Schiappa, the Pennsylvaniabred gelding also captured the award for Outstanding Older Male.

The leading horsemen at Parx were nearly a repeat from the past several years. Patricia Farro took home Leading Trainer for the third time in four years, while Frankie Pennington successfully earned his fourth career Leading Jockey title. Ten Strike Racing also captured their second straight Leading Owner crown.

Leading "Division B" Owner went to Kirwan Equine Group, Inc., while Joseph Taylor took the Leading "Division B" Trainer award. Dexter Haddock captured the Leading Apprentice Jockey title.

Also honored with awards were Sweet Candy Dance (Two-Year-old Female), Diamond King (Two-Year-Old Male), Tiz Rude (Three-Year-Old Female), Midtowncharlybrown (Three-Year-Old Male), Firsthand Report (Older Female), Cozy Lover (Claiming Horse of the Year), Dirt in Your Face (Outstanding Claim of the Year) and Wendy Wend (Winningest Horse).

The evening was also a difficult one for horsemen, as we began to say goodbye to a rider who truly left his mark on Parx Racing. Jose Flores was a special jockey and an even more impressive man. We will miss him and I give my deepest condolences to his family, including his wife Joanne and sons Julien, Junior and Juan.

Another part of the ceremonies was to thank several legislators - Sen. John Rafferty, Rep. Mike Carroll and Rep. Thomas Mehaffie. All three have unabashedly supported horse racing, and for their efforts, we have presented them with the honor of Legislators of the Year.

As we approach the new fiscal year, we are working with these legislators and more to yet again protect the Pennsylvania Race Horse Development Fund (RHDF), which continues to be a target for additional funds to balance the budget, even though last year we were successful in getting an amendment passed to the RHDF which clarified that it is *not a tax*.

This has become increasingly difficult and more frustrating, as recent misinformation has been printed stating incorrect facts about the RHDF. Remember what I stated last year at the PA House of Representatives' Gaming Oversight Committee meeting: "...When the RHDF (Act 71) was enacted, an assessment - not a tax - was agreed to by track operators to offset the negative impact additional gaming (slots) would have on the well-established equine racing program within PA. It is very important that I make this point. NOT ONE DIME OF TAXPAYER DOLLARS GOES TO THE RHDF. NOT ONE. I state this in the strongest terms possible because some, in the legislature and elsewhere, have stated the opposite and they are simply wrong."

Be sure to know that PTHA Executive Director Mike Ballezzi and I will join our lobbyists in Harrisburg over the next few months to ensure that our funds remain available for you, the horsemen of Pennsylvania.

Parx Community Mourns the Loss of Jockey Jose Flores



On Thursday, March 22, 2018, Parx Racing Hall of Fame rider and the track's all-time leading money-earner Jose Luis Flores tragically succumbed to injuries suffered from a fall during the ninth race on Monday, March 19, 2018. He is survived by his loving wife, Joanne McDaid-Flores, their seven-year-old son Julien, and two adult sons – Junior and Juan.

In 2013, Flores was unanimously selected for induction into the Parx Racing Hall of Fame. He rode in over 28,000 races and captured 4,650 victories while earning more than \$64 million. His most prestigious victory occurred when he guided Loaded Gun to the wire ahead of Breeders' Cup Sprint champion Artax in the \$200,000 Philadelphia Park Breeders' Cup Handicap (G3). Flores was also the regular rider for stakes winners Arlo, Discreet Lover, Dulce Realidad, Eighth Wonder, Il Villano, Raging Rapids and The Maccabee.

MEMORIES OF JOSE FLORES

"He was a true gentleman rider. He would ride a 60-1 shot as hard as he'd ride a favorite, and work for a two-horse outfit just as soon as a 20-horse barn. He rode for just about every trainer on the grounds. Jose was a good-natured, good-hearted guy. He had money but he loved to ride. He'd say, 'Why should I stop? I love the morning training, I love the afternoons, I love the camaraderie." -David Yanuzzi, longtime agent for Jose Flores

"It's unbelievable... He was just tremendous, a nice guy, always a professional." -Scott Lake, trainer at Parx Racing

"Whoever coined the phrase that nice guys finish last never met Jose. He finished first a lot. 4,650 times in fact... As great as his success was, he accepted all of it with the greatest humility. And while his statistics indeed define his career on the track, those numbers don't begin to tell you the whole story of a truly great man. Hating to use a cliche - but here I must - you'd simply not find a nicer guy anywhere than Jose Flores. His quiet, unassuming manner belied the competitive drive that took him to the winner's circle so many, many times. Never flashy or exuberant, his entrance into the winner's circle was that of the ultimate consummate professional. Never one to show up his fellow jockeys, you'd find him perched atop his mount with nothing but class." -Keith Jones, announcer at Parx Racing





MATCH Series is Back



The popular MATCH Series (Mid-Atlantic Thoroughbred Championships) is returning in 2018 after a 16-year hiatus.

The Thoroughbred Horsemen's Association and its affiliates in Delaware, Maryland, New Jersey and Pennsylvania; Maryland Jockey Club (Pimlico Race Course and Laurel Park); Delaware Park; Greenwood Gaming and Entertainment (Parx); Penn National Gaming (Hollywood Casino at Penn National Race Course); Darby Development (Monmouth Park); Eldorado Resorts (Presque Isle Downs & Casino); and the Pennsylvania Horsemen's Benevolent and Protective Association are proud to announce their joint participation after regional discussions during the past six months led to an agreement to revive the MATCH Series and expand cooperation among all stakeholders in the Mid-Atlantic region.

The MATCH Series, which debuted in 1997 and ran for five years, is an innovative regional racing series and the only one of its kind in racing that combines

rich stakes and bonuses for participating owners and trainers over a five-month span. Horses competing in MATCH earn points based on participation and order of finish, and the leading points earners in each of the series divisions, as well as the overall owner and trainer points leaders, win lucrative bonuses.

Total purse money is \$2.9 million. Horsemen will compete for \$450,000 in bonus money, all contributed by the participating horsemen's organizations. The first-, second- and third-place owners, respectively, in each division will earn \$20,000, \$15,000, and \$10,000. The top three earning trainers will earn \$15,000, \$10,000 and \$5,000 respectively. The MATCH Series overall top earning owner will win \$50,000, while the top earning trainer will earn \$25,000.

The participating tracks have all agreed to support the MATCH Series divisions and not run races in competition with them. Participating horsemen will have a regional roadmap of stakes for their horses from May to September. Racing directors at each of the participating tracks worked together to select divisions that could provide the least amount of overlap and, hopefully, larger fields for all concerned.

On April 19, 2018, the MATCH Series gained even further momentum with the announcement that each breeders' organization in the region will also pay bonuses to the highest point-earning male and female from each program, totaling \$40,000 in added prize money.

What Ever Happened To ...?

Three former Parx Racing-based mares gave birth to their next generation of foals this spring!

Eighth Wonder captured the first five races of her career, including the \$100,000 Parx Oaks, \$100,000 Jostle Stakes and the \$75,000 Donna Freyer Stakes. \$220,000 in earnings for trainer Penny Pearce before she was retired by owner Edward Ridge. She had her first foal this spring at Diamond B Farm, a pretty PA-Bred filly by Talent Search.

Pewter Stable campaigned the stakes-placed, allowance-winning Offlee Golden during her racing career. She was officially the first mare to foal in Pennsylvania when she gave birth to a Verrazano colt at 1:20 am on New Year's Day - several weeks premature!







With ten years of rehabilitation, retraining and rehoming our retiring racehorses at Parx in the books, the PTHA's Turning for Home story has turned into the clearest conceivable picture for what responsible racehorse retirement should be. Similar programs such as Finger Lakes Thoroughbred Adoption Program (FTLAP) have asked how we are able to help so many horses, and joined several aftercare programs who are adopting our time-tested funding model. Not every track has the support offered to Pennsylvania horses, which is largely the result of the Race Horse Development Fund, which helps sustain the PA Thoroughbred racing programs through use of slot money - zero tax dollars. Every program can take a page from our book on how to model their funding.

The fundamental principles conceived by our Executive Director Michael Ballezzi and the PTHA leadership ten years ago remain in place:

- Provide all Parx horsemen with an alternative to sending horses to slaughter by accepting all eligible horses, regardless of physical condition, for zero additional fee.
- Maintain a program that is fiscally responsible and fully self sustaining without relying on outside funding. Encourage an industry-wide climate for resposible aftercare & foster positive PR.


- Send the majority of funding directly along with each horse to approved facilities that will provide the best possible aftercare.
- Advocate the off-track Thoroughbred as the premier sporthorses and pleasure horses that they can be in order to create new safe homes for our horses.

Despite due diligence to start each horse on a safe path, there is always room for improvement. Tracking horses as they change hands throughout their lives is the most important thing we can do for the former connections who entrust us with their horses. To that end, we have a carefully monitored adoption system that follows up with adopters intensively for the first year, and we now have additional staff to assist with yearly check-ins and follow-up. Our goal is to be proactive in protecting our horses throughout their lives and we have been rewarded with greater participation and respect for our horses and our program.

An amusing realization came about as we tracked the impact of these young athletes - they've already generated an economy of their own as they are bred, raised and started racing. A safe estimate for a homebred Thoroughbred racehorse is that it takes \$30,000 to get him to his first race, but given the opportunity to go on to a second career, he will

> continue to contribute more than ever to the economy. Keeping a horse supports agriculture, training a horse supports an entire equine community, and showing a horse - now we've dipped into tourism. That means for 80% of their lifetime, our former racehorses continue to support the careers of thousands. For example, a medium-sized show circuit employs twenty people just on show day, and who doesn't need something from the tack shop when they're getting ready to compete?

So, while we're still learning the best way to facilitate transitioning a racehorse into a second career, horses are still teaching us how valuable they are. Essentially, we are working for them.





Fantasy Contest Winner Donates Prize to Turning for Home



Chaplain's Corner Chaplain Rick Bunker

"... 'O Israel, the one who formed you says, 'Do not be afraid, for I have ransomed you. I have called you by name; you are mine. ²When you go through deep waters, I will be with you. When you go through rivers of difficulty, you will not drown. When

you walk through the fire of oppression, you will not be burned up; the flames will not consume you. ³For I am the LORD, your God, the Holy One of Israel, you Savior . . . " - Isaiah 43:1-3 (NLT)

Not even the noise cancelling headphones could cancel this loud woman. I decided to go get something to eat and come back later to this 'quiet room' to write. I did not want to be alone, so I didn't want to go to my room to write. I came back later and it was even louder. How was I going to finish this Chaplain Corner? Well, I had decided, a few days earlier that I would probably write it on times of difficulty. Was this experience qualifying me to write with more authority? I suppose this experience should not qualify as a time of difficulty. Maybe it's the blaring classical music (to drown out this loud person and now her friends) that is making me feel overly dramatic. Then again, so often, it is the 'little things' piled up day after day, that can make it greatly difficult to be polite, relaxed, and cope gracefully, with all the things that life throws at us.

In Seattle there is a saying, "Live like the mountain is out." Seattle is surrounded with majestic landscapes and brilliantly colorful flora, but many days, perhaps most days, the human eye cannot see it. The people of the Seattle area will tell of the great difference Mt. Ranier being "out" and not being "out" makes to a day. One Seattle denizen put it, "Typically, when the mountain is out, the sun is also out. With the blue sky comes clearer visibility of the vast and varied colors... 
